VEGETABLES AND FRUIT

Each exhibit must be of one variety (cultivar) only (unless otherwise stated). Varieties don't have to be named (except herbs, class 26) however for the interest of visitors, it is encouraged.

Class

1. Five potatoes
2. Four carrots (with tops trimmed to approx. 10cm)
3. Five onions
4. Three globe beetroot (tops trimmed to approx. 10cm)
5. Ten shallots
6. Six radishes
7. One cabbage (with approx. 7.5cm trimmed stem)
8. One cauliflower (approx. 7.5cm trimmed stem)
9. One lettuce (roots washed and wrapped eg small plastic bag)
10. Two cucumbers
11. Six pods of peas (with stalks)
12. Six runner beans (with stalks)
13. Six dwarf (French) beans (with stalks)
14. Six pods of broad beans (with stalks)
15. Three sweet peppers (capsicum)
16. Three courgettes

17. Two of any one kind of other vegetable not scheduled
18. Three sticks of rhubarb (leaves trimmed to approx. 7.5cm)
19. Six tomatoes (standard cultivars) with calyces
20. Ten small-fruited tomatoes with calyces (ie cherry/plum types)
21. Longest runner bean
22. Two marrows
23. One marrow (heaviest)
24. Ten raspberries with calyces (green tops)
25. Any other fruit (number at exhibitors discretion)
26. Collection of four named culinary herbs, cut and displayed in water
27. An unusual or amusingly shaped vegetable
28. Collection of five single vegetables, one of each (displayed in an area not to exceed 46 x 46 cm)

FLOWERS

All cut flower exhibits must be displayed in water or water retaining materials

29. Roses three blooms mixed or one cultivar (variety)
30. Single specimen rose
31. Cluster (floribunda or spray) roses one stem
32. Pot plant, pot no larger than 15cm diameter
33. Chrysanthemums, three sprays
34. Nine sweet peas, one cultivar or mixed
35. Antirrhinum, three stems
36. Dahlias, three blooms one cultivar
37. Dahlias, three blooms mixed cultivars
38. Dahlia, single specimen bloom
39. One vase annuals, one or more cultivars, single or mixed colours
40. One vase perennials, one or more cultivars, single or mixed colour

FLORAL ART

41. An arrangement suitable for a dining table
42. An arrangement in a raised container – one colour to predominate
43. An exhibit on a tennis theme, to include accessories

DOMESTIC PRODUCE

44. Victoria sponge cake, your own recipe
45. Six Brownies

52. One jar of home-made jam, named eg. raspberry

CHILDRENS CLASSES

No entry fee charged for these classes. To be judged in two categories: 7 years and under; and 8-11 years.

- 64. Miniature garden in a tray (maximum tray size 45cm x 30cm)
- 65. A decorated egg (can have attachments) (hardboiled or blown please!)
- 66. A piece of art, made from recycled materials
- 67. Painting or drawing – 'At the seaside'
- 68. A poem about animals and pets
- 69. An 'edible' necklace
- 70. Vegetable novelty (eg an animal or object, made mainly from vegetables and/or fruit)
- 71. Six small cakes, decorated

Further information

This show is open to all, subject to the terms and conditions listed below:

1. Entry for children’s classes is free. The entry fee for all other classes is 50p.
2. Only one member of each household may enter each of classes 1-40 and classes 54 and 55. Maximum one entry per person per class.
3. Exhibitors are responsible for ensuring the entry is correctly placed on the tables in the hall. No exhibits will be admitted after 11am on the day of the Show. The Victory Hall will be open to exhibitors from 8.30am.
4. Only amateurs are eligible to complete in any class (an amateur for the purposes of this rule shall be one whose livelihood does not depend wholly or mainly on the type of work entered in the class: either gardener, caterer, flower arranger, artist, seamstress, photographer etc). Please check with the Show Secretary if you require clarification.
5. The judges may not award places if they consider exhibits are deficient in merit, or there are less than three entries in a class.
6. No exhibit shall be removed from the Hall before 4.00pm.
7. The Show Committee will take every care of exhibits, but will not be responsible for loss or damage, however caused.
